

Criminal Charges for Administrators



- Denton ISD-Principal charged with electioneering
- City View ISD- 7 administrators arrested for failure to report
- Fort Bend ISD- 2 school administrators charged with misconduct
- Houston ISD-CFO charged with bribery
- El Paso ISD-principal and associate sup charged with scheming to defraud the federal accountability system.
- Hutto ISD-3 charged with different crimes

The Incident



- Happened on November 29, 2018
- Charges filed 2 years later 1 week before the statute of limitations ran out
- Chargers included were:
 - Assault of a special needs student
 - Unlawful restraint
 - Tampering with governmental records
- An arrest warrant was issued
- Turned myself into the Williamson County Jail 2 days later
- Spent the day in jail until bail was set at \$16,000
 - \circ I had to pay \$1600

The Trial

- Took a full week (M-F, 8:30-5:30)
- Jury of 6 instead of 12 (misdemeanor trial rules)
- Assistant District Attorney and her assistant(s) on one side
- My attorneys and I on the other side
- Judge up front
- The judge helped the lawyers if they objected to the wrong thing. She helped the prosecution more than the defence
- Both sides had the chance to call witnesses including experts (this cost \$3000
 - O Each witness was cross examined by the other side
 - O Both sides could also call rebuttal witnesses at the end


